AGREEMENT FOR STUDENT EXCHANGE BETWEEN

NATIONAL CHENG KUNG UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING TAINAN, TAIWAN, ROC

AND

KOREA UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING SEOUL, REPUBLIC OF KOREA

National Cheng Kung University (NCKU), through its College of Engineering, and Korea University (KU), through its College of Engineering, agree to implement a Student Exchange Agreement in accordance with the principles and guidelines set forth below. The purpose of this Agreement is to enhance the educational experiences and the cultural understanding of students and faculty from both institutions.

Student Exchange Criteria

It is agreed that:

- 1. This Agreement enables exchange students to take courses at the host institution on a non-degree basis. Courses passed at the host institution will normally be accepted for credit towards the degree at the candidate's home institution in which s/he is enrolled. It will be the responsibility of each participant in the student exchange program to obtain official approval from his/her own institution for courses taken at the host institution.
- 2. Within the framework of this exchange, "home institution" means the institution in which a student is formally enrolled as a degree candidate, and "host institution" means the institution that has agreed to receive students from the home institution for a period of study on a non-degree basis.
- 3. Participants in this exchange program initially will be drawn from the College of Engineering at NCKU, and the College of Engineering at KU, at the discretion of the two institutions. By addendum, the exchange can be extended to include other colleges and departments, as long as the principle of a balanced exchange is maintained.
- 4. Participants will be screened for eligibility for admission by the home institution. Each university shall respect the admission and enrollment requirements of the host institution. Participants will be subject to the standard rules, regulations, and enrollment requirements of the host institution in the selection of courses.

This includes requirements of language proficiency. The host institution shall have final authority on admission decisions. The obligations of the two institutions under this Agreement are limited to exchange students only and do not extend to spouses and dependents.

- 5. The departments/divisions involved in the exchange at the home institution will provide academic counseling to ensure that the academic courses taken at the host institution are acceptable to the home institution. The host institution will provide course descriptions and syllabi to aid in course equivalency evaluation.
- 6. Academic achievement reports will be sent to the student's home institution at the conclusion of each semester, not later than six weeks after the last day of final examinations. Participants may be asked to pay a fee to the host institution for this service.

Student Responsibilities and Expenses

- 7. Participating students will be required to register at their home institution and to pay all academic fees and tuition to their home institution. Participants will be exempted from paying such fees and tuition to the host institution.
- 8. The host institution will assist its guest students, to the fullest extent possible, in obtaining visas and other documents required by the government of the host country.
- 9. Neither NCKU nor KU will be responsible for the costs of room, board, travel, or other personal expenses (including books) of participants. The parties acknowledge that they will require the participants to pay these costs.
- 10. Participants in the exchange will be governed by the same regulations and performance standards that pertain to other students at the host institution.

Legal Indemnities and Policies

- 11. No monetary consideration will be exchanged between the two institutions, nor will there be any indemnities, reimbursements for expenses, or sharing of fees or profits arising from the exchange.
- 12. The parties agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims by exchange participants, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts or omission on the part of either university or any of their employees. The relationship of NCKU and KU under this Agreement shall be that of independent contractors, and a party shall not be deemed, nor hold itself out as being, a partner or agent of the other party. Neither NCKU nor KU shall be liable for acts of the other, nor shall they be liable for the acts of students participating in the exchange.
- 13. Both institutions subscribe to a policy of equal opportunity and will not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, age, height, weight, marital or familial status, ethnicity, religion, national origin, or disability.

Review, Contacts, Signatories

14. This Agreement is subject to review at the end of the first year and shall be effective for five years (i.e., from the 2009-10 academic year through the 2014-15 academic year). It shall be subject to revision, modification or renewal by mutual written agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement by written notice submitted at least 90 days in advance of a new academic semester. Termination of this Agreement would not affect students who have already engaged in this Agreement. If this Agreement is not renewed by mutual consent, it will conclude at the end of the specified time period, or after activities in progress have concluded.
